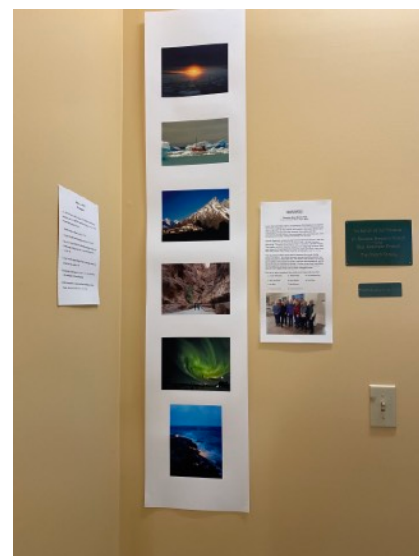
Our monthly sunset walk gathered after the walk for snacks, a fire and conversation.



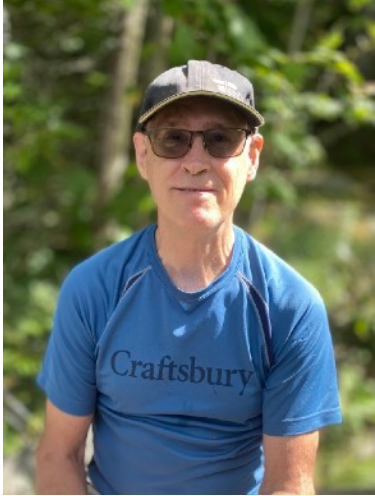

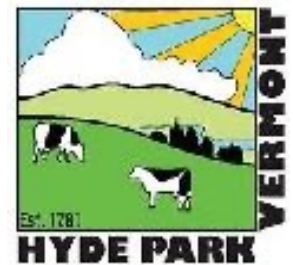
